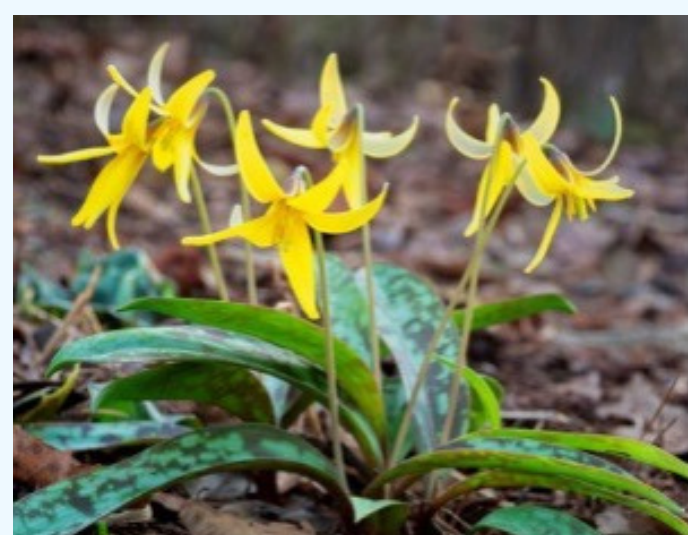


The Next 100 Years: A Planned Approach to Planting Trees

The Chappaqua Library is sponsoring the Zoom event. Dennis Corelli, New Castle's Environmental Coordinator, will discuss planting native and landscape tree species in our town. Topics will include photoperiod, appropriateness, aesthetics, species resistance, soils; emphasis on Hydrologic Regime preferences and introduce Regional Wetland Plant Rating Classifications associated with specific species.

Upon signing up, community members who registered to watch the presentation will be given a ticket for a free potted tree or shrub sapling which will be available for pick up at the Library in early May.
